Such a "Washington Consensus", championed by the United States of America, has also been embraced by multilateral institutions such as the IMF and the World Bank.

More recently, with the victories of Donald Trump and a number of populist candidates in other democracies, such a "Washington Consensus" has been undermined. Trade wars, tech wars, de-globalization are dominating newspaper headlines.
