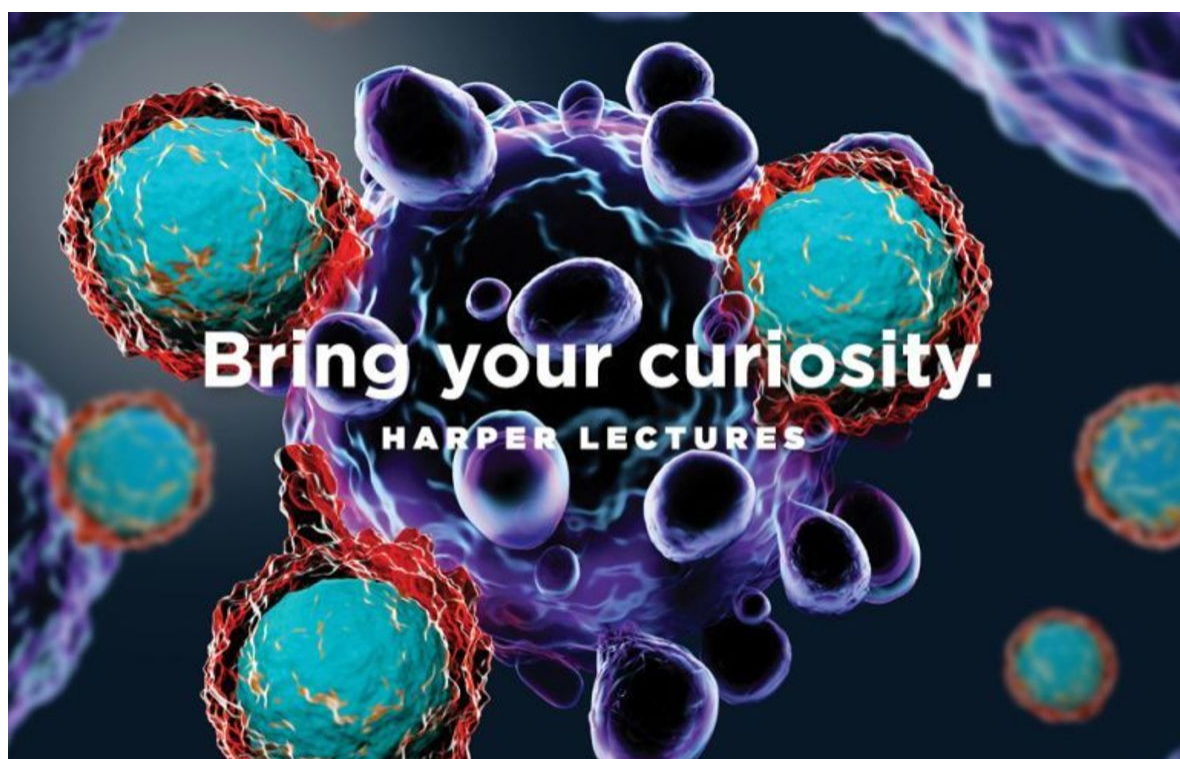
### Trade Wars, Economic Uncertainty, and the US/China Relationship: What's Next? (Jan 29)
