Human migrations and relocations have been taking place for centuries, but the last 75 years have seen major population shifts from rural areas to urban centers. Urbanization comes from both in-migration and transnational migrations due to an array of social and economic factors. In this talk, Professor Lenore Grenoble will discuss the causes of urban multilingualism, and how questions of linguistic diversity play into issues of identity and nationalism in the home, across social networks, in local neighborhoods, and the larger context of the city as a whole
