In 2015, the anonymous leak of the Panama Papers brought to light millions of financial and legal documents exposing how the super-rich hide their money using complex webs of offshore vehicles.

“Spiderweb Capitalism”, a book by **Kimberly Kay Hoang**, Professor of Sociology at the University of Chicago, sheds critical light on how global elites capitalize on risky frontier markets, and the people who facilitate the illicit movement of wealth across borders and around the globe. The talk will deepen our understanding of the paradoxical ways in which global economic growth is sustained through states where the line separating the legal from the corrupt is not always clear.
