This event is part of the Social Impact Leadership Series (SILS), a program under The Hong Kong Jockey Club Programme on Social Innovation.

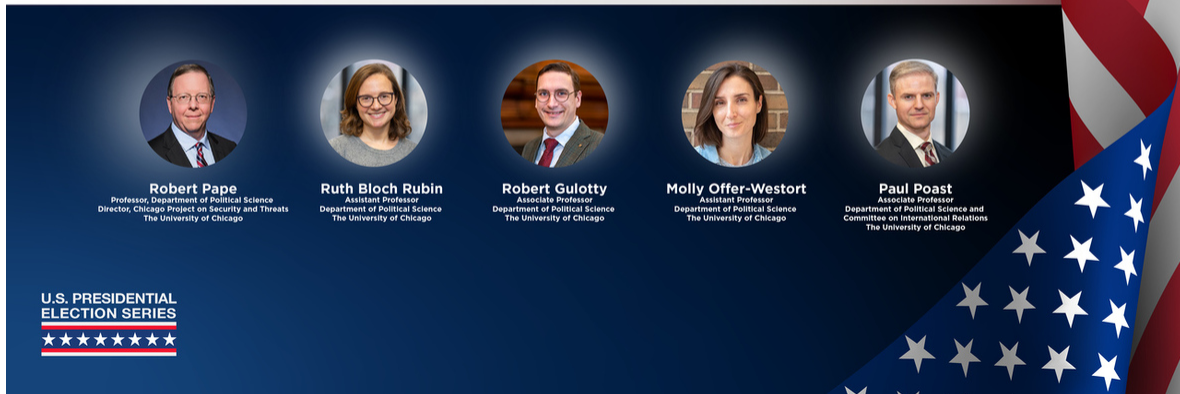
